## WELCOME

March 2020 stopped us in our tracks along with the rest of our industry, community and indeed the country. Assisted or friends and Guardians of the company we very quickly realised that we had to focus on what we could do rather than what we couldn't.

A year of research and development under the banner of The Year of Exploration began - an opportunity for us as a company to pause, reflect and improve on areas of our practice, take risks, try new ways of working with new collaborators and develop as artists and organisation.

We reached out to our community of artists, initiated a book club, a virtual open door policy for artists to connect with us when they needed support, a podcast which took audiences behind the scenes to meet the people who make our work possible, started new relationships with Taking Flight, Vocal Eyes and Stage Text to make our work more accessible, explored for the first time multimedia technology and even commissioned a new play, all made possible by the support of Arts Council England.

Our residency at Greenwich Theatre sadly concluded but we remain committed to making work with and for our local audiences. As we look to find our new forever home we look forward to working with new partners, new venues, new artists and to connecting and reconnecting with our audiences. We have survived, it is time to emerge.

Over the past 18 months we have asked ourselves what relevance do classics and the theatre more generally have, how do they help us right here and right now? Our response - we need to be able to come together again, to hear, to tell, to share stories, to feel connected, to be communal, to hear the laughter, feel the sorrow, sense the heartbeat of others. Above all we need to reignite the unique power of theatre - we dare to dream.






